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Officer Narrative [2133091]

On 03/13/22 at approximately 16:40 hrs. I was notified by dispatch that Copley Hospital (ER Department) needed assistance from Police in removing Steven Eldred from the hospital. The ER doctor had requested 2 Officers. Officer Marcoux had arrived prior to me and made contact first with Eldred. I met with Officer Marcoux inside the ER department who told me that Eldred had already been seen by mental health and the doctor, they had cleared and released him allowing him to leave on his own but he was refusing to leave.

When I entered room 7, Eldred- dressed in scrubs, was lying on the bed yelling into the phone that was on speakerphone, a woman was talking to him trying to calm him down. He told the woman that he was going to fight us and pull our gun against us like he did in the past with an officer from MPD.

Officer Marcoux and I were standing approximately 4-5 feet away from the foot of the bed. When he hung up the phone, I calmly asked him if there was a place we could take him. With his hands behind his head in a relaxed position, he yelled for me to leave. I told him that I couldn't do that.

Eldred continued to stare at me, he suddenly jumped out of bed in a rage yelling unintelligible words as if he was going to come at me. When he stood up, his arms appeared to be still and his fists were clenched.

I drew my taser from the holster and held it at a ready position. I directed Eldred that he either place his hands behind his back and we would escort him out of the hospital or he could walk out free willingly. Eldred layed back down on the bed. I explained his two options again.

Eldred stood back up out of the bed and walked towards his personal belongings that were on the chair in the corner. He continued to yell and stare at me.

While Eldred stood still in front of the chair with his cloths, he quickly grabbed his bag and flinched towards me in a way as if he was going to make a surprise attack. I activated the CEW's safety switch to fire and pointed the laser at his abdomen. He waked back to the bed and proceeded to put on his cloths at his own slow pace, all awhile continuing to yell explicit and threaten harm to me and Officer Marcoux. I continued to hold the taser with the laser pointed at him during this process.

Once Eldred finished getting dressed, I re-holstered my taser. Officer Marcoux and I escorted him out of the hospital.
